2020 WINTER SHELTER GUIDE

SAFETY PROTOCOLS at different shelters may vary slightly, but masks and social distancing are required at all facilities. At the Fairgrounds, guests will be able to take their masks off when they are on their cots by themselves, maintaining six foot distance from others, and while eating. Belongings will be searched upon entry to ensure everyone's safety.

DAY SHELTERS

- **Room In The Inn, 705 Drexel:** M-F, 6am-2pm; S-S, 6am-12pm
- **Community Care Fellowship, also known as "Ken & Carol's":** 511 S. 8th St., M-F 9am-3pm
- **Nashville Rescue Mission:** 639 Lafayette St. for men and 1716 Rosa Parks Blvd. for women (this is only for guests who are staying at the Mission and have tested negative for COVID)*

EVENING SHELTERS

- For **single men (dogs welcome after 12/1): Nashville Rescue Mission**, 639 Lafayette St., 615-255-2475*
- For **single men (no pets): Room In The Inn**, check in during the day, limited capacity, 705 Drexel St., 615-251-7019
- For **single women and women with children (dogs welcome after 12/1): Nashville Rescue Mission Women's Guest Services**, 1716 Rosa L Parks Blvd., 615-312-1574*
- For **families:** Call the Coordinated Entry Line M-F, 8am-4pm, 615-862-6444
- For **youth ages 13-17: Oasis Center Hotline**, 615-327-4455 (LGBTQIA+ friendly)
- For **youth ages 18-24: Launchpad** is working with local hotels with a limited capacity, must call ahead, 615-375-6274 (LGBTQIA+ friendly)
- For **couples and people who can't or won't go to other shelters (dogs welcome - call ahead with other animals):**
 - When the temperature is projected to be below 28 degrees, Metro Social Services will open their overflow shelter at the **Fairgrounds**, 500 Wedgewood Ave., bus line 52, 7pm-7am.
 - To find out if the overflow shelter is open, go to www.coldweathernashville.com or call 615-862-6391. The website and call line are updated each day by 9am.
 - (This shelter is also open to people who identify as **transgender**. Staff will respect the gender that the person identifies with.)

*All incoming guests must have had a negative COVID test within 24 hours. If someone has been barred from the Mission in the past, please let them know that all bars for non-violent offenses have been lifted. Call 615-255-2475 with questions.
